QUICK UPDATES ON GLUCOMETERS

We know it's hard to keep track of which insurances cover which glucometers and testing supplies! For the moment, these are important tips to know:

Healthy San Francisco covers Aviva meter + Aviva plus test strips + Softclix lancets

- Aviva plus test strips are on back order at the ZSFG outpatient pharmacy and clinics, but this is only temporary. Supplies cannot be obtained at outside pharmacies, must be rx'd to the outpatient pharmacy
- In the near future, since the Aviva meter is no longer being manufactured, SFHN
 has chosen the Accu-chek Guide meter for the preferred meter. No action is
 needed at this point since the transition has not been finalized. Stay tuned

SFHP medi-cal covers <u>Guide</u> or <u>Guide Me</u> meter + <u>Guide</u> test strips + either <u>Softclix</u> lancets or <u>Fastclix</u> lancet drums

- What's the difference? The Guide meter can be set in many different languages, however the screen display is smaller. The Guide Me meter is only available in English, but the buttons and screen view are larger.
- Originally, Guide and Guide Me meters were all shipped with the Fastclix lancing device. Due to user feedback, all new meter kits are now being shipped with the Softclix lancing device. If your patient needs refills, be sure to ask if they are using the individual Softclix lancets (#100/box) or the Fastclix lancet drums (#102/box)

Anthem BC medi-cal covers TrueMetrix meter + <u>True</u> test strips + <u>True plus</u> lancets

Medicare will cover a variety of meters
